
# All the tools you need to take action – in one course

The course will take you on a journey through Gaia Education's 4 Pillars of Sustainability – Social, Ecological, Economic and Worldview. These pillars provide a comprehensive overview of leading edge thinking that promotes regenerative sustainable futures.

We provide an action learning 'design team' experience where together with fellow participants you can apply the strategies, tools and models you're learning in the course to existing projects within The Park, ecovillage. Learning how to work and collaborate effectively in this mini-community can be adapted to work with any group.

In the final week the Findhorn EDE offers a unique experience where you will hone your Participatory Facilitation skills; this approach will be useful for engaging your local community in regenerative projects, the emphasis being on learning how to empower others through drawing out and pooling collective wisdom.
